### Update on our new rescue - Moose California

GPRA has always been a "do what is needed" rescue but our Moose California wins our longest distance rescue! Becky at Atlanta Lab Rescue reached out about one of their adopters in California who had adopted an approximately 1 year old Great Pyr to avoid having the rescue there amputate his leg "as it was cheaper and easier" than doing the correct surgery. Sabine reached out - long story short after a long transport from California Moose had surgery Tuesday with Dr. Corse, GPRA's ortho specialist, to repair his severe right patella luxation along with correcting the external rotations of his tarsal joint to straighten his leg. His adopter in California helped raise money to pay for the transport and part of the surgery and recruited a friend in Atlanta to foster Moose. Sabine did a fundraiser and our amazing GPRA donors helped raise the money to cover the balance. Moose is doing great after surgery and is "the sweetest dog"!
