Dear Great Pyrenees Friends,

Thank you to those that have already donated. Here is the first as told by Sabine.

New Year's Eve 2023 in Alabama - after a domestic dispute, a woman ran her husband over with her car and killed him. He left behind nine Great Pyrenees dogs. Once we learned about the situation, GPRA decided to step up and take some of the dogs into our program. A few days later, we were on the way to pick up dogs. After our arrival we found out quickly that these dogs are not being used to humans much and it was not an easy task to even approach them. They came up friendly, took treats, but wanted nothing to do with a collar or a leash! We had help from Kevin, who is the Director of Marshall County Animal Control. Our main focus was a highly pregnant female and the younger dogs/puppies that we believed to be between 6-10 months old. We learned from a neighbor that there was previously another litter of little puppies, but they were given away right after the tragedy had happened.

The 11-year-old senior female Pyr had relocated across the street to a neighbor's house already, and he said he would be more than happy to keep her and care for her. The highly pregnant female dog was in high protective mode, running away and hiding in the woods. We tried for a while to follow her, but she got more and more stressed and we were concerned that she would go into labor. Unfortunately, we had to stop following her to avoid this outcome.

We were able to catch four of the younger dogs and put them in our vehicle to bring them back to Georgia. They went into boarding at our partner vet clinic, Animal Wellness Clinic. All received medical care and went into foster homes within the following days. We named the dogs after characters from the Sherlock Holmes Series. These were the 4 that were caught on the first day.

The neighbors at the Alabama house set up a mattress and a heat light in the open carport for the mama dog to have her puppies by her house. It was extremely cold in January. Barely a week later I got a call from my AL contact that the Mama had her puppies in a mud puddle overnight. She lost them all. We were gutted. Unfortunately she did not deem her home carport safe anymore. Too much had happened, and the adult dogs especially seemed traumatized. It was our mission to get the remaining dogs into rescue, it was just a matter of catching them now. Part 2 of this story in next week's communication.
