Rusty - Story told by his transporter, Tammy Lee

Heart-rendering situations come up far too often in the rescue business! We were reminded of this fact in July, when GPRA was contacted by Elbert County Animal Control. They told us they had gone into a home to rescue 37 dogs from hoarders, and Rusty the Great Pyrenees was one of them.

We traveled to pick up Rusty as soon as we could. When speaking with the Animal Control officers that went into the home, they described "an environmental disaster". The owners hadn't allowed the dogs outside, so urine and fecal matter was all over the house. The officers likened it to walking on an ice rink. Horrifically, they also found deceased animals in a back room of the house. There were rodents, bugs and black mold in the home. Animal Control found no dog food in the house. GPRA not only took in Rusty, but also helped to find a rescue that would take in the other dogs too.

When Rusty was first brought out, he had such a sad look, but he immediately leaned in for love. He laid his head on the center console of the car for pets during transport. However, we did not get back until after our veterinary clinic had already closed for the day. Due to poor Rusty's situation, Louise, one of the wonderful workers at Animal Wellness Clinic, came back to allow Rusty's intake. He was scared and sick, but so sweet, and quickly became a favorite amongst staff and volunteers alike.

Rusty's medical challenges were numerous. He had mange, severe ear infections, several types of parasites, as well as being severely malnourished. His ear infections were so severe that he needed sedation so that cultures could be taken and medicine administered. Medical baths helped slowly restore Rusty's skin and coat to its lustrous Pyrenees greatness. Volunteers brought high protein food add-ins like ground beef, chicken and turkey to help bring him to a healthy weight.

Rusty has needed a lot of tender care to bring out his playful Pyrenees nature. He is now a healthy boy who is ready for a normal dog life, all thanks to the efforts of GPRA volunteers and Animal Wellness Clinic's medical expertise. This kind of happy ending does not happen without the generosity of dog lovers like yourselves.

GPRA is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, so all donations are tax deductible. None of our volunteers are paid and virtually all donations go toward the medical care of our GIANTS.


